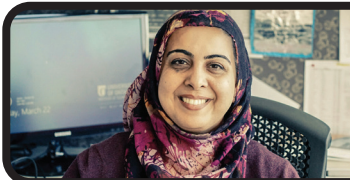


"Planning a course that gets students fully into the material is a lot of work. With four courses it's not always possible to do justice to what we want our students to leave here knowing. And that is really frustrating."
